In the 1860 US Federal Census for Bethlehem, Cass, Indiana, 55-year old New Jersey-born farmer William R Smith has \$3,000 worth of real estate and \$800 worth of personal property. He and his 49-year old New Jersey-born wife Amanda [maiden name unknown] Smith have in their household their 18-year old Indiana born son, Job.<sup>2</sup>

In the 1880 US Federal Census for Bethlehem, Cass, Indiana, 38-year old Indiana-born farmer Job E and his 35-year old Indiana-born wife Emeline [Cool] Smith have in their household their Indiana-born children, 11-year old Omer, 8-year old Nora, 5-year old Ego, 3-year old Milo and 2-month old Roscoe (born March). Also in their household is their nephew, 15-year old Indiana-born Melvin Champ. Job's parents were born in New Jersey and Emeline's in New York.<sup>3</sup>

in the 1900 US Federal Census for Bethlehem, Cass, Indiana, 58-year old Indiana-born farmer Job E and his 55-year old Indiana-born wife Emeline [Cool] Smith have been married 32 years and have had seven children all of whom are living. Five of them are still living with their parents, 28-year old housekeeper Nora, 23-year old school teacher Milo S, 20-year old farm laborer Rosco, 15-year old farm laborer Elmer and 13-year old Bernice. Elmer and Bernice have attended school 6 months of the past year. Job owns his farm clear of mortgage. Job's father was born in New Jersey and his mother in Ohio. Emeline's parents were born in New York.<sup>1</sup>

In the 1910 US Federal Census for Bethlehem, Cass, Indiana, 68-year old Indiana-born farmer Job E and his 65-year old Indiana-born wife Emeline [Cool] Smith have been married 42 years and have had seven children, but only six are living. Two of their daughters are living with their parents, 38-year old Nora and 24-year old Bernice. Job is recorded as living on his "own income" and Bernice is a "housekeeper for a private family". Job is listed as being blind. The family is living on a farm that Job owns, free of mortgage, on Chestnut Road. Living next door, are Job and Emeline's son, 35-year old Indiana-born farmer Ego, Ego's 32-year old Indiana-born wife Linnie [Linnie Blackketter] Smith and their two Indiana-born children, 9-year old Harold and 4-year old Geraldine. Harold has attended school in the past year. This family is living on a rented farm, presumably rented from Job, where Ego does "General Farming".<sup>4</sup>

Emeline's 45-year old farmer son Ego, his 45-year old wife Linnie [Linnie Blackketter] Smith, their two children, 20-year old Harold B and 15-year old Bonnie G [Geraldine on the 1910 census] and a 15-year old boarder John Adkin are living a few farms away. Ego is still farming rented land. Everyone in these two families is literate. Harold, Bonnie and John have attended school in the past year.<sup>8</sup></p>
